



# Attendance Dues

Everything parents and caregivers  
need to know about

## Why you pay Attendance Dues

As a condition of enrolment at an integrated school, there is a legal requirement for parents and caregivers to pay Attendance Dues. Some of the Dues help provide the land and buildings needed for our Marist Schools.

## What your Dues are used for

Dues are used to repay loans for building work done at Marcellin, St Paul's and Sacred Heart Colleges. These loans are incurred to provide school facilities to the standard of comparable State schools. They are also used for school building work, insurance costs and other property related costs.

## What Dues will cost you

Dues are set on a yearly basis and are applicable for all integrated schools throughout Auckland. There are two levels; Years 7 & 8 and Years 9 through 13. In 2012 the Dues will be:

Years 7 & 8                    \$380.00 per year or \$95.00 per term. (This includes GST of 15%)

Years 9 to 13                \$746.00 per year or \$186.50 per term. (This includes GST of 15%)

NOTE: The Attendance Dues do not include the Internal Fees/Levy's/Donations set by Colleges; they are invoiced separately by the Colleges.

## How to pay your Dues

Dues are invoiced by the New Zealand Marist Brothers' Trust Board from their Administration Office. An account is sent for each student with the total amount per term/year listed. You will be able to choose from the following methods of payment;

To your School; - Cash, Cheque or Eftpos.

To the Administration Office; - Cheque

Electronically; - Automatic Payment, Direct Debit (from wages) or Internet Banking

## Is Assistance Available?

All parents and caregivers with children at Catholic integrated schools are expected to pay their Attendance Dues. In order that no child should be denied a Catholic Education because of family financial hardship, a rebate may be granted. To arrange for such assistance, you should contact your School Principal or the NZ Marist Brothers Trust Board in the first instance. Assistance is not available for non-preference students at Marcellin, St Paul's or Sacred Heart Colleges.
